## What to Expect During Your Day of Mohs Surgery with Us

Below is an overview to assist you with preparing for the Mohs micrographic surgery. In addition, please visit us at [www.dermsurgery.net](http://www.dermsurgery.net) to watch a brief but informative video about Mohs micrographic surgery.

1. Dr. Behroozan will review your medical history, allergies, medications, perform an exam, and explain what to expect during the day. Dr. Behroozan will confirm the location of the skin cancer with you and review the results of the skin biopsy.
2. A photograph and measurement of the skin cancer will be taken.
3. The area will be numbed with a local anesthetic (exactly like the time of the biopsy).
4. Dr. Behroozan will obtain a skin sample (a Mohs layer or "stage") from the area with the cancer with the goal of removing it.
5. Our team will secure a temporary bandage to the site and escort you back to the waiting room or have you rest in the exam room.
6. The Mohs layer will be immediately processed and then examined under the microscope by Dr. Behroozan, who is specially trained in skin cancer removal and microscopic examination.
7. In about 1 hour, you will be informed whether Dr. Behroozan needs to take another layer or whether the cancer has already been removed completely.
8. Dr. Behroozan may need to take additional layers until all the skin cancer is removed. **Because there is no way of predicting how many stages will be necessary, expect to spend the whole day with us.**
9. Once the cancer is completely removed, Dr. Behroozan will discuss with you the repair and healing options, which may include allowing the area to heal on its own or closing it up with stitches.
10. Post operative instructions and possibly a prescription for antibiotics may be given as well as a follow-up appointment in 1-2 weeks for a wound check and/or suture removal.



## **PRE-SURGERY INSTRUCTIONS**

1. Continue your regular medications as usual but **DO NOT** take any aspirin or herbal supplements 10 days prior to your procedure unless another physician has advised otherwise.
2. **DO NOT** smoke one week before surgery.
3. If you take **Coumadin** (Warfarin) or other blood thinners, continue taking them.
4. Please notify us if you have an artificial joint or heart valve, if you ever had rheumatic fever or a heart murmur, or if a doctor ever recommended you take antibiotics prior to surgery or teeth cleaning.
5. Get a good night's rest.
6. Eat breakfast as usual on the day of the procedure.
7. If you are having Mohs micrographic surgery, *expect to stay the whole day with us*. Therefore, bring snacks, your laptop (we have Internet access) and reading/work material to stay occupied.
8. Please arrive 15 minutes early.
